Atmos Energy's corporate office is located in Dallas, Texas. It is one of the largest pure natural gas distribution companies in the United States, supplying natural gas service to over three million customers in eight states. In Kansas, Atmos Energy provides natural gas service to approximately 139,000 customers.

Atmos Energy's last rate increase of \$3.0 million (after accounting for the reduction in the GRS charge, the net impact revenue requirement was a decrease of \$223,953) was approved on February 24, 2020.

Atmos Energy is also requesting to implement a Voluntary Smart Choice Carbon Offset Tariff (SCCO). The SCCO rider is designed to provide customers the voluntary option to offset some or all of the carbon emissions associated with their natural gas usage through Atmos Energy's purchase and retirement of Carbon Credits on their behalf.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING AND COMMENT PERIOD CONCERNING ATMOS ENERGY RATE INCREASE REQUEST.



Atmos Energy filed an application with the Kansas Corporation Commission (Commission) requesting an overall net revenue increase of \$8.3 million. The requested increase would affect the portions of a customer's bill that relate to the delivery of gas by Atmos Energy to customers, including the fixed monthly Facility Charge and Commodity Charge (per hundred cubic feet (Ccf) usage charge).

If approved, the average monthly bill for residential customers will increase by approximately \$5.60 per month, or 6.4% increase. This includes an increase in the monthly Facility Charge/GSRS Charge from \$20.20 per month to \$25.71 per month and resetting the GSRS charge to zero. In addition, the gas charge for residential customers will increase to \$0.15128/Ccf from \$0.14994/Ccf.

Atmos Energy is recommending no change to the rates of customers served under commercial sales, public authority sales, school sales, large industrial interruptible sales, or any transportation customers.

VIRTUAL PUBLIC HEARING

The Commission has scheduled a virtual public hearing, via Zoom, to allow Atmos Energy's customers the opportunity to learn more about the application and to speak to the Commission about the proposed rate increase. The virtual public hearing is scheduled for:

EVIDENTIARY HEARING

The Commission has scheduled an evidentiary hearing on the Atmos Energy rate increase request beginning March 7, 2023 at 9:00 a.m. The hearing will be broadcast on the KCC's YouTube Channel. The Commission will issue a decision by May 9, 2023.

MORE ABOUT ATMOS ENERGY'S PROPOSAL

In its application, Atmos Energy said the increase was necessary because the company has continued to make investments in its system to provide safe, reliable and efficient natural gas service to its customers. The company further stated it has experienced increases in wages, medical expenses and material and supplier costs.

To achieve an overall net revenue increase of \$8.3 million, Atmos Energy is requesting to increase base rates by \$12.4 million by moving the \$3.5 million currently collected through the Gas System Reliability Surcharge Rider (GSRS), which customers are already paying, into base rates. An additional \$0.6 million currently collected through the Ad Valorem Tax Surcharge Rider (AVTS) will also be moved into base rates.

Atmos Energy is requesting an increase in the current budget and five-year extension of its System Integrity Program (SIP) tariff. The increase in the current budget would be from \$35 million to \$50 million. The five-year extension is being requested to further accelerate Atmos Energy's progress in the replacement of obsolete materials in its Kansas system.

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
